


Students: How to Respond to a Blog

1. Log onto your teacher's blog – they will give you the website address.
2. At the bottom of the blog, you will see a link called COMMENTS. Click it. See example below.

Chemical Reactions in Everyday Life

We've been spending a lot of time working on problems involving chemical reactions. But, what does this really have to do with everyday life?

For example, the gasoline you put in your car is made up of a solution of different liquid hydrocarbon fuels (octane, ethanol and others). When your car engine burns these fuels for energy to make the car move, a combustion reaction occurs. Carbon dioxide and water are produced as this reaction occurs and these products are expelled through the tailpipe into the atmosphere.


For each of the other different type of chemical reactions (double replacement, single replacement, composition, decomposition), describe a real life application in a similar manner as I have done above. Be as specific as you can but remember, your writing needs to "make sense" to the general public (the rest of us who are reading your post). Yet, you need to address the science concepts we have been discussing in class.


4. When you get done, you will select a profile from the drop down menu. If you don't have a blogger account set up yet, select GOOGLE ACCOUNT.
5. Then, click POST COMMENT.

6. You will then see this screen:

7. If you don't have a Google account to blog, click the CREATE AN ACCOUNT NOW.
8. Fill in the appropriate information. Use a name that your teacher will recognize that it is YOU. Don't use something like "princess2009" or "superman3887" as a signon name. When done, click the orange continue button.
9. After you get your Google account set up to blog, you will be re-directed back to the screen above.
10. Fill in the information to sign in.
11. Your post will automatically be sent to your teacher to first review. Then, if she or he decides your work is valid/appropriate, they will post it on the internet blog site.
